



Un activista del controvertido sitio de investigación Bellingcat ha intentado que Twitter prohíba a un bloguero canadiense, quien destapó sus enlaces a una red de propaganda encubierta respaldada por el Reino Unido.

Una publicación reciente en Twitter por un blogger canadiense, Stephen McIntyre, aparentemente no le sentó bien a Dan Kaszeta, un [colaborador](#) activo del autodenominado sitio web de investigación de "periodismo ciudadano" Bellingcat. El canadiense aparentemente provocó la ira del activista al resaltar algunas de sus conexiones con la Iniciativa de Integridad (II), un canal de propaganda clandestino financiado por el gobierno del Reino Unido.

McIntyre publicó una factura enviada por la firma de Kaszeta, Strongpoint Security, que facturaba a la organización matriz de II, el Institute for Statecraft, por aproximadamente \$ 800 por un artículo escrito por el citado. El documento es parte de los datos de II filtrados en la red. El ex veterano del Ejército de los Estados Unidos se molestó bastante y se dirigió a la administración de Twitter, exigiendo que se prohibiera al bloguero por exponer sus datos personales. Argumenta que la publicación de datos personales está prohibida por las reglas de Twitter.

I appeal to the general user of Twitter to report the private information I posted on the public information page of the Bellingcat website. I am not disclosing any of the following: credit card information, social security or other national identity numbers, private addresses, personal home addresses, or other locations that are considered to be private information. I am not disclosing any of the following: credit card information, social security or other national identity numbers, private addresses, personal home addresses, or other locations that are considered to be private information.

Twitter policy may limit "some categories of information that is not considered private disclosure - places of education or employment." My tweet that Bellingcat's Dan Kaszeta had been employed by the so-called Stagnant Initiative (which I described as a "UK government propaganda campaign") falls squarely within that permission. In addition, this information had already been published on the internet - I provided a link to my tweet. My statement that Kaszeta had "published" opinions on Syrian chemical attacks was the opposite of "private information," but public information.
